Jakob Edler (Germany/UK) is Professor of Innovation Policy and Strategy and Executive Director of the Manchester Institute of Innovation Research at the University of Manchester. He was previously leading the Department of Innovation Systems and Policy at the Fraunhofer Institute for Systems and Innovation Research, Germany. He has published widely on a range of issues in public policy for R&I as well as on strategic innovation management of companies. One of his key focus areas in recent years has been the study and conceptualization of demand-oriented policy approaches, with a focus on public procurement of innovation. Jakob has acted as consultant to the OECD, the World Bank, the Inter-American Development Bank, the World Intellectual Property Office, the European Commission, and numerous national and regional governments across Europe. He is member of the Austrian Council for Research and Technological Development and the German Academy for Science and Engineering and a Fellow of the Royal Society for the Encouragement of Arts, Manufactures and Commerce. He is also President of the European Forum for Studies of Policies for Research and Innovation (Eu-SPRI Forum). He was awarded his PhD in political science by the University of Mannheim (with distinction) and holds two master degrees from the University of Mannheim (Business Administration/Management and Political Science/Economic History). He was a Fulbright student at the Dartmouth College, New Hampshire, and had an internship at the European Commission, DG Research, Brussels during his doctoral studies.



Mark W.J. Ferguson (Ireland) is Director-General of Science Foundation Ireland and Chief Scientific Adviser to the Government of Ireland since 2012. Previously he was professor in life sciences at the University of Manchester (since 1984) and co-founder, CEO and Chairman of Renovo Group plc (1998-2011). He is the recipient of numerous international research awards including the 2002 European Science Prize (jointly), and is the author of 327 research papers and book chapters, 60 patent families and author/editor of 8 books. Mark graduated from the Queens University of Belfast with degrees in Dentistry (BDS 1st class honours), Anatomy and Embryology (BSc 1st class honours, PhD) and Medical Sciences (DMedSc), holds Fellowships from the Royal Colleges of Surgeons in Ireland (FFD), and Edinburgh (FDS) and is a Founding Fellow of the UK Academy of Medical Sciences (FMedSci). He is a member or Fellow of a number of learned Societies, and was made a "Commander of the British Empire" (CBE) by the Queen in 1999 for services to Health and Life Sciences.



Erja Heikkinen (Finland) has been with the Ministry of Education and Culture in Finland since 2005. She is currently heading the Science Policy Group of the Department of Higher Education and Science Policy. The group has both national and international responsibilities in developing the research and innovation system. Dr. Heikkinen switched from the academia to the public administration in 1995, when she started to develop the newly established Finnish graduate school system. She moved on in 1997 to the Finnish national supercomputing center CSC - IT center for science - where she was responsible for bioinformatics services. In 2001, Dr. Heikkinen joined the National Technology Agency Tekes, where her tasks involved funding of private and public organisations in research projects combining bioscience, medicine and ICT. Her training is in evolutionary biology with a PhD degree in population genetics.



Andrea Höglinger (Austria) is Head of Division European and International Programmes at the Austrian Research Promotion Agency (FFG) and acts as the Austrian National Contact Point Coordinator for Horizon 2020. She has been with the FFG since 2000 and was appointed Head of Division for European and International Programmes in 2011. FFG is the national funding agency for applied research and promotes research and innovation at national, European and international level. As Head of Division, she is actively involved in several EU-funded initiatives, mainly aiming at strengthening the international cooperation of research organisations. In a project of the EU Framework Programme, she was responsible for the development of an Austrian Training Academy for European Programmes. Currently she represents the Austrian NCPs in the EU-funded initiative "NCP –

Academy", which brings together and implements trainings on cross-cutting issues for National Contact Points in Europe.



Krzysztof Klincewicz (Poland) is Professor at the Faculty of Management and Rector's Deputy for IP Management, University of Warsaw, Poland. He specializes in management of technology and innovation, with particular interest in strategies of technology firms and R&D management. Prior to joining the University, he had worked in high-tech industry in Poland, Finland and in the UK (1997-2004) and at the Tokyo Institute of Technology (2004-2006). Expert in analysing innovation policies of EU member states in the "ERAWATCH", "Research and Innovation Observatory" and "Stairway-to-Excellence" projects of the EC. Member of the UN Technology Executive Committee (2011-2015). Lead EU expert, negotiating climate technology development and transfer at the UNFCCC (2011-2015).

Coordinator of experts in Green Technology Accelerator GreenEvo, established by the government of Poland to support environmental technology companies (2010-2013).



Urban Krajcar (Slovenia) is Director-General of Science Directorate at the Ministry of Education, Science and Sport by the Slovene Government. He started his career as the counsellor at the European Commission's Representation in Slovenia, where he was involved in the process of Slovenia's accession to the European Union. In 2009, he took the position of the Head of the Minister's Cabinet at the Government's Office for Local Self-Government and Regional Policy. In 2010 he joined the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Technology, where he was the Head of Unit for Structural Funds, responsible for the implementation of major R&D instruments in the framework of EU Structural Funds, before moving to the current

position in 2013. He is also Vice-president of the Governing Board at the University of Ljubljana.



Benoît Legaît (France) is Chairman of the Committee « Technology and Society » at the General Council for Economy (French Ministry for Economy), and referent for research and innovation. He was previously Director of Mines ParisTech, a well-known engineering school in France, as well as the Vice-President of the Conférence des Grandes Écoles. He also had extensive private sector experiences in consulting and managerial positions, having worked for Usinor, Institut Français du Pétrole and BEICP-FRANLAB. Benoît Legaît was awarded with the National Order of Merit (1998), the Order of Academic Palms (2000) and the National Order of the Legion of Honour (2007). He defended with honours a PhD thesis in fluid flow in porous media in 1985.



Marjan Oudeman (Netherlands) is President of the Executive Board of Utrecht University in the Netherlands since July 2013. She is among others responsible for strategy and effective knowledge transfer of the university. She is also a non-executive board member of Solvay SA (Belgium), Statoil ASA (Norway) and SHV Holdings (Netherlands). Before joining Utrecht University, Marjan Oudeman was member of the Executive Committee of Tata Steel Europe (previously Corus Group plc) and as Executive Director, Strip Products Division responsible for all strip businesses in the UK, the Netherlands and other parts of the world (including relevant R&D activities). In 2010, she joined the Executive Committee of Akzo Nobel (Netherlands), where her areas of responsibility were HR, organizational development and the activities in BRIC countries. Between 2007-2010, she was

also member of the Dutch Innovation Platform, a platform established to stimulate and accelerate innovations in the Netherlands, chaired by the Prime Minister with representatives of the government, science and industry.
